# **Find Library Resources**

Introduction

As you explore what topic to research, the types of sources to consult will include books, journals and credible websites. One of your first steps should be to go to the Estelle M. 

Examples of citations for a book, journal article and website are shown below. Example of a citation for an article from a website in MLA Style:

Herkenhoff, Ken. "NASA Mars Rover Curiosity Rover: Mission Updates:

Sols 1237-1238: CHIMRA Diagnostics." 27 Jan 2016. NASA Jet

Propulsion Laboratory. Web. 28 Jan 2016.

#### Conclusion

Good library research begins with knowing how to find sources of information. Confidence in finding different types of sources results from experience visiting the library itself and navigating on the library web page to use tools such as the Library Catalog and Research Databases lists.
